

Instructions:

Step 1: Read the challenges and pick a bingo line that most appeals to you.

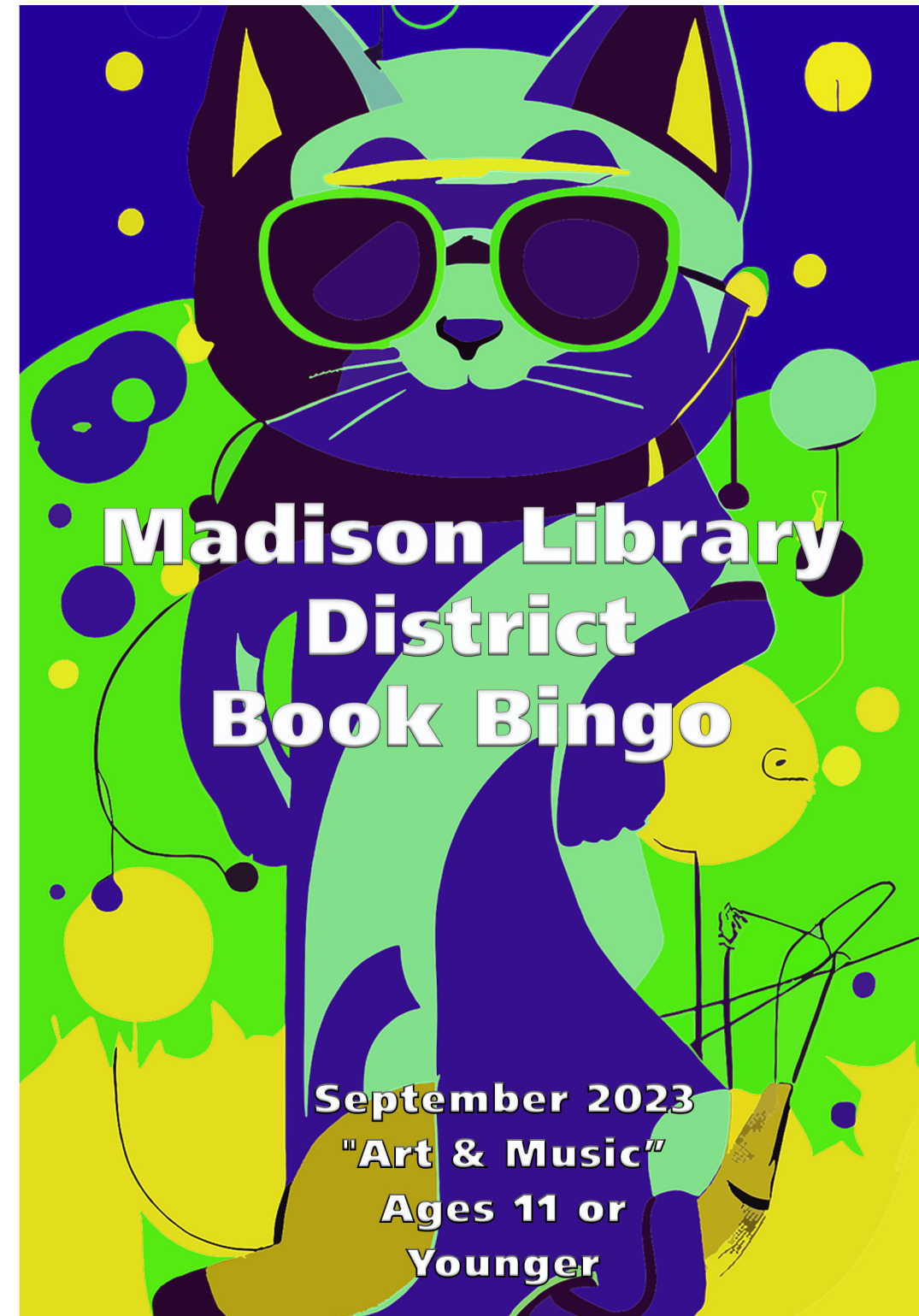
Step 2: Read a book that completes a challenge. Read another. And another.

Step 3: When you are able to cross off 5 squares in a row on the board, bring your sheet in to the Circulation Desk for a prize and an entry in our monthly drawing. We will have a separate drawing for each age group.

Step 4: Keep reading! You can get as many prizes and entries as there are bingos on the board. The game ends on the last day of the month.

Rules of Play:

1. This challenge is open to patrons of the Madison Library District who **can read on their own and are age 11 or younger**. You must have a valid library card number to play or your parent or guardian must be a card holder.
2. Challenge dates go from the first to the last of each month. No entries will be accepted for a previous month's challenge after the 3rd of the new month (or the next open weekday if the Library is closed on the 3rd). Drawings will be held the following day.
3. Any books read during the current month may be used for the challenge even if starting the challenge mid-month.
4. Challenges may be completed in any order.
5. To count for a challenge, books must contain chapters and be at least 60 pages long to count. Plays or books of poetry may be combined to reach the 60 page minimum. Picture books do not count for this challenge.
6. Any form of book (print, audio, or ebook) is acceptable unless otherwise stated in the task. For the length of audio or e-books, please research the length of the print version to make sure it is of appropriate length.
7. Each book that is read can only be used for one square, with the following exception: Books over 300 pages may count for TWO squares, as long as the book fits both challenges. If your book is over 500 pages, it may count for THREE squares, but, again, it must fit all three challenges.
8. Limit of one bingo sheet per person per month. If you complete an entire board in a month, you will need to wait until the new month begins to start the new board.
9. Have fun! Branch out and read something new. Many times we can discover new favorites by reading outside of our usual choices.

In music, the 3-B's are Bach 1685-1750, Beethoven 1770-1827, and Brahms 1833-1897. Read a book that takes place during one of their lifetimes.	Solfège is a system of learning the musical scale (Do, Re, Mi, Fa, Sol, La, Ti). Read a book with a title that has at least 4 letters from the Solfège system.	Shakespeare said, "If music be the food of love, play on!" Read a book with some type of food on the cover.	Performing cover songs is quite popular, especially among budding musicians. Read a book that is a retold classic.	The woodwind group of musical instruments include the clarinet, piccolo and bassoon. Read a book with the word 'WIND' in the title.
Read a book with an art project in progress on the cover, such as a painting, drawing, sculpture, etc.	The Divje Babe flute, carved from a cave bear femur, is thought to be at least 50,000 years old. Read a history book or a historical fiction.	Read a book with a character who is an artist of some kind.	Read a book with some sort of musical instrument on the cover.	The Impressionists are a well-known group of artists from the 1800's. Read a book by a well-known, best-selling author.
Collage art uses a variety of materials layered together, from paper and paint to pieces of metal or fabric. In the spirit of collage, read a book of short stories.	Mushrooms can produce electrical impulses that can be turned into music via Biodata Sonification. Read a book with a mushroom on the cover.	What a pretty picture! Read a book of your choice.	Bob Ross was known for painting happy trees and clouds. Read a book with a tree or clouds on the cover.	The percussion group of musical instruments includes drums, cymbals, and pianos. Read a book with the word 'DRUM' in the title.
Sculpture is a three dimensional art form. Read a book with an embossed cover.	The brass group of musical instruments includes tubas, trumpets, and French horns. Read a book with the word 'HORN' in the title.	The musical scale is made up of 7 lettered notes. Read a book that begins with A, B, C, D, E, F, or G. The word "A" does not count.	Isaac Newton invented the color wheel used in art. Read a book with 2 colors from the wheel: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet.	One favorite genre of music is called New Wave or Alternative. Read a book by an author who's initials can be found in NEW WAVE ALTERNATIVE.
Illustrations have been used for hundreds of years in both children's and adult books. Read a book that includes illustrations.	Four important elements in art are line, color, shape, and texture. Read a book with some sort of geometric shape on the cover.	Art adds color to the world. Read a book that has at least 5 colors on the cover.	Music is a big part of many people's lives. Read a book where a character plays an instrument.	Do you paint with watercolors? Read a book with some sort of water on the cover.
